Note: similar orders are needed as for blood / platelets:

The **“Blood Type”** order is needed for the initial transfusion of FFP. **The “Blood Type” order is good for 72 hours.** If it is within the 72 hour window, you do not need to place an additional “Blood Type” order.

The **“Fresh Frozen Plasma”** order goes to the blood bank where you will have to define number of units and either to **Transfuse**, or to **Hold** the FFP.

The **“Transfuse”** order corresponds to each unit of FFP that you wish to transfuse and it not only notifies the nurse to transfuse, but also allows the nurse to chart on it (so that you can later review if and when it was given).
